

Nov. 6 - Depart the USA

Your pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA on an overnight flight.

Nov. 7 - Arrive in the Holy Land

Once you arrive, you will be welcomed at the Tel Aviv airport by our representative and transferred to your hotel in Netanya to enjoy dinner and overnight.

Nov. 8 - Caesarea by the Sea, Mount Carmel, Megiddo & Nazareth

Visit the Roman aqueduct and theatre at Caesarea, a center of early Christianity (Acts 10) and where Paul was imprisoned for two years (Acts 23:33). View Mount Carmel and recall Elijah's dramatic victory over the prophets of Baal (I Kings 18). Conclude your day in Nazareth, Jesus' boyhood home (Matt. 2:23). Visit Mount Precipice, where Luke describes how Jesus was rejected by those in the synagogue after He taught them. Filled with anger, they "led Him unto the brow of the hill whereon their city was built, that they might cast Him down headlong" (Luke 4:29).

Nov. 9 - Mount Arbel, Valley of the Wind and Doves, Magdala, Mount of Beatitudes, Tabgha & Primacy of Peter

Travel to Mount Arbel and walk along its peak for a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee and the area where Jesus ministered, with extended views of Mount Hermon in the north and Mount Tabor in the south. It is a magnificent photo opportunity. Walk through a portion of the Valley of the Doves, the route Jesus and the disciples would have taken from Nazareth. In Magdala, once home to Mary Magdalene (Luke 8:1-3), visit a recently discovered first-century synagogue. On the Mount of Beatitudes, contemplate the text of the Sermon on the Mount that Jesus preached there (Matt. 5-7). Explore the Church of the Loaves and Fish at Tabgha, the traditional site of the feeding of the 5,000 (Luke 9:10-17). Walk down to the shore of the Sea at the Primacy of Peter, a small chapel dedicated to the appearance of Jesus here after the Resurrection.

Nov. 10 - Jesus Boat, Sea of Galilee Boat ride and Service, Capernaum

At Kibbutz Nof Ginosar, see the 2,000-year-old "ancient boat," a rare example of the kind of boat in which Jesus might have sailed. Sail upon the waters of the Sea of Galilee on a very special boat ride, complete with an onboard worship service. Visit Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in Galilee, and visit the synagogue built on the site where Jesus taught (Matt. 4:13, 23). Remember your baptism at the Yardenit Baptismal site, where the Jordan River exits the Sea of Galilee on its journey southward (Matt. 3).

Nov. 11 - Gideon's Spring, Shiloh & Samaria

Visit Ein Harod (Judges 7:1), the spring where Gideon gathered his men to fight the Midianites. Visit the tel at Shiloh once the center of Hebrew worship until the Philistines took the Ark of the Covenant. Visit Samaria, the capital of the Northern Kingdom and home to Ahab and Jezebel.

Nov. 12 - Hazor, Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi & Golan Heights

Explore Hazor, one of the oldest archaeological sites in Israel. Here, Joshua fought against Jabin (Josh 11:1 -11). Hazor was later fortified by Solomon. At the ruins of Tel Dan, see the altar built by King Jeroboam I (I Kings 12:25 -30) and learn about where the "House of David" fragment from the First Temple Period was discovered. Continue to Caesarea Philippi, where Peter told the Lord, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God!" (Matt. 16: 16). A scenic drive along the Golan Heights will give you some beautiful views of Syria and Jordan as well as Israel.



Nov. 13 - Beit Shean, Qasr El Yehud and Jericho

Explore the massive excavations at Beth Shean, a city continuously inhabited for over 5,000 years, including when the Philistines hung the bodies of King Saul and his sons from its walls (1 Sam. 31). Later known as Scythopolis, the ruins of this once-opulent Roman city still impresses visitors with its city streets, marble sidewalks, Roman public baths, and theater. Visit the Baptismal Site at Qasr el Yehud, where many believe that Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist (John 1). Head to Jericho to visit the ruins of the ancient city Joshua conquered (Josh. 6:20). Off in the distance, you can see the traditional site of the Temptation of Jesus (Matt. 4:1). Finish the day at your Dead Sea hotel and spa with access to the Dead Sea.

Nov. 14 - Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran, and the Judean Wilderness

Enjoy a visit to Masada, the spectacular mountaintop fortress built by Herod that later became the final tragic stronghold of the Jewish rebellion against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore the fortress and look down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp below. Journey to the oasis of Ein Gedi, where David and his men sought refuge from Saul (1 Sam. 23). Stop in Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947 by a Bedouin shepherd. Pass through the Judean Wilderness, where Jesus was tempted, and the parable of the Good Samaritan is thought to have occurred. Finish the day in your hotel in Jerusalem.

Nov. 15 - Bethlehem and Bethany

In Bethlehem, gaze out over Shepherds' Field and visit the cave revered as Jesus' birthplace (Luke 2:1 -20). Visit the Church of the Nativity, built above the cave and considered the world's oldest functioning church (Luke 2). See an olive wood factory and how this has evolved into a thriving business for the Christian community here. Continue to Bethany, where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11). Inside the Church of St. Lazarus are mosaics that date back to the Byzantine church that originally stood there.

Nov. 16 - Jerusalem

Walk the Temple Mount (conditions permitting), once the site of the Temple of Solomon (II Chronicles 3) and home to the Dome of the Rock. Spend time in prayer at the Western Wall (the only remnant of the Second Temple of Jerusalem) and sit on the Teaching Steps where Jesus taught. Walk along the foundational walls of the Temple Mount through the Rabbi's Tunnels. Walk through Cardo, once the Roman market and now lined with shops. Wander through the excavations of the City of David. Explore Hezekiah's Tunnel, an amazing engineering feat dug from either end and met in the middle (Note: Those who are claustrophobic may want to meet the group at the other end of the tunnel). Walk the steps to the Pool of Siloam, recently uncovered at the foot of the city. Walk a portion of the Pilgrims Path, recently uncovered, that led from the pool toward the Temple Mount.

Nov. 17 - Jerusalem

Stand on the Mount of Olives for a remarkable view of Jerusalem (the Golden City); Jesus stood here before ascending into heaven forty days after His resurrection (Acts 1:9 -12). In the Kidron Valley across from the walls of Jerusalem, pray as Jesus did in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matt. 26:36). Continue to Mount Zion to visit the House of the High Priest Caiaphas, where Jesus was questioned the night of His betrayal (Matt. 26:57). Recall the events of the Last Supper as you visit the traditional location of the Upper Room (Mark 14:12 -26).

Nov. 18 - Jerusalem

See where Jesus healed on the Sabbath at the Pool of Bethesda (John 5: 1-18). Walk the Via Dolorosa ("the Way of the Cross") to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (John 19), built over the traditional sites of the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. At the Garden Tomb, share communion together and experience the reality of the Resurrection (John 20).

Nov. 19 - Return to the USA

Nov. 19 - Jerash

This morning, you will journey across the Allenby Bridge on your way to Jerash, one of the best-preserved Roman cities in the world. Stroll through the oval piazza and wander along colonnaded streets etched by the wheels of ancient chariots. Stand in the grand theatre where an onstage whisper can be heard in the top row. Continue to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 20 - Petra

Begin your journey south towards Petra today. Explore the city of Petra. Its entrance passes through a long, narrow gorge known as the Siq and can only be accessed by carriage, horseback or on foot. Once inside the city, marvel at the intricate detail of a city that was cut into the cliff sides of rose-colored rock. Travel to your hotel at the Dead Sea for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 21 - Madaba and Mount Nebo

Travel to Madaba, the City of Mosaics, to visit the Church of Saint George with its sixth-century, Byzantine, mosaic map showing Jerusalem and other holy sites. Continue to Mount Nebo, where Moses caught a glimpse of the Promised Land (Deut. 34). On a clear day, you can see all the way across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea to the rooftops of Jerusalem and Bethlehem. Recross into Israel, spend the afternoon in Jerusalem or Tel Aviv. Have dinner and transfer to airport.

Nov. 22 - Return to the USA

Guests taking an extension may be on a different flight than their group and/or traveling companion.
